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Mothers are to be Humble before the Lord by Jacqueline Thorpe

“And Mary said, My soul doth magnify the Lord, And my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. For he hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden.,” (Luke 1:46-48).

Mother’s Day 2011, is now behind us, but always before us is the example of Mary, the mother of Jesus as a woman who served God in humility and was exalted for it. Holiness without humility is not possible. Attempting to be a godly mother without holiness or humility is not possible. Without humility a mother will turn to her “own understanding” as she raises her children rather than leaning on God’s wisdom.

It is important for children to experience a mother, in fact parents, who are humble enough to put themselves aside and turn to God for life’s answers. Children of humble parents become humble parents.

Pride is the opposite of humility. A prideful mother does not mirror Mary. Mary regarded her lowly (sinful) estate and acknowledged that she needed a Savior. Pride is a stumbling block to salvation for one has to have a broken and contrite heart in order to love and accept submission to Jesus.

Mothers without humble hearts model pride to their children. Yet it is from humility that obedience grows. God knows that a humble Mom sows obedience into her children.

“And his mercy is on them that fear him from generation to generation,” (Luke 1:50). []

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Mind Your *T*'s & *Y*'s: Understanding King James Pronouns by Pastor Hammond

"It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God," (Matthew 4:4).

Living according to "every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God" (Matt. 4:4) requires that we learn to understand every word of scripture as best as we can. Yet, any honest pastor will admit that the Elizabethan-era English of our King James Bible, while excellent, can be challenging to modern readers. One of the first challenges that we face is the six so-called Elizabethan *pronouns* - thou, thee, thy, thine, ye, and you.

It's fair to ask if these "old fashioned" pronouns matter – especially given that most modern Bible versions have replaced them with simplified pronouns. For example, they typically replace "ye" with "you." While that change may seem reasonable, readers must understand that dropping the use of the Elizabethan pronouns obscures the meaning of the Greek and Hebrew words that underlie our English King James Bible. In fact, when translators change "ye" to "you," they are necessarily changing God's words!

Let's take a closer look at the issue. Biblical Greek differentiates between *singular pronouns* that refer to one person (thou, thee, and thine) and *plural pronouns* that refer to multiple people (you, ye). It also differentiates between pronouns that serve as subjects and objects in a sentence.

Here's a simple rule: In our KJV Bible, pronouns that begin with "T" are always singular (refer to one person); Pronouns that begin with "Y" are always plural (refer to multiple people). *One man noted that a helpful way to remember this rule is that "T" looks like one stick whereas "Y" pictures more than one stick.*

As noted above, Biblical Greek also uses different forms of pronouns to identify *subjects* and *objects* in a sentence. Recall that, in a sentence, a *subject* is the person who is performing an action. The object is a person or thing that is receiving action. **Consider this sentence:** "Mary is feeding the baby." Mary" is the *subject*, i.e. the one performing the action.

"Baby" is the *object*, i.e. the one upon whom the action is being performed. **Now consider John 3:7, where Jesus said,** "Marvel not that I said unto thee (**singular**, object form), ye (**plural**, subject form) must be born again." The use of precise pronouns in our King James Bible make it clear that while Jesus was speaking to one man, His message was that **all** people must be born again. However, the New International Version (NIV) obscures that fact that all must be born again. It translates John 3:7: "You should not be surprised at my saying, You must be born again" (NIV).

Similar distinctions are made in the Biblical Hebrew that underlies our KJV Old Testament. Consider Exodus 4:15: "And thou (2nd person singular, subject form) shalt speak unto him, and put words in his mouth: and I will be with thy (2nd person singular, possessive form) mouth, and with his mouth, and will teach you (plural, object form) what ye (plural, subject form) shall do" (KJV).

E. L. Bynum notes that, in the above verse, we see the pronouns "thou," "thy," "you," and "ye," all fulfilling a specific function. Modern translations are more likely to read: "You shall speak to him ...and I will be with your mouth ... and will teach you what you shall do." In choosing to simplify the translation, they obscure the precision and clarity of the underlying Hebrew words. However, our KJV makes it clear that the LORD told Moses that he (Moses) was to speak to Aaron, and that He (the LORD) would then teach both of them (not just Moses) what they were to do.

A Helpful Chart of Elizabethan Pronouns :

"T" pronouns are singular (and always 2nd person)

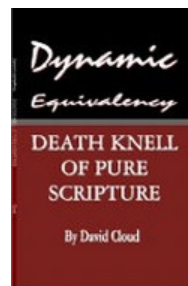
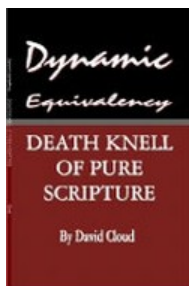
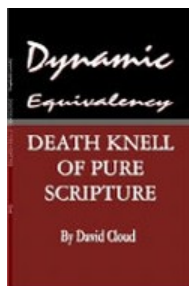
1. *Thou* = subject form
2. *Thee* = object form
3. "Thy" & "Thine" show possession

"Y" pronouns are plural (and always 2nd person)

1. *Ye* = Subject form
2. *You* = object form
3. "*Your(s)*" shows possession

Dynamic Equivalency: Death Knell of Pure Scripture

by David Cloud, *Way of Life Literature*, soft-cover, 91 pages.

(Matthew 4:4) "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by **every word** that proceedeth out of the mouth of God."

In our April issue, we introduced many of the reasons for our decision to use only the *King James Bible* at Long Hill Baptist Church. One of the most important reasons that we introduced is that many of the modern Bible versions -- including the popular *New International Version* (NIV) and *New Living Translation* (NLT) -- use an unacceptable approach to Bible translation.

Brother David Cloud has written a short, easy-to-understand book that helps Christians understand the dangers of the *dynamic equivalence* approach to translation. This helpful volume offers a complete definition of the approach, together with an overview of its principals, influence, and leaders. And, importantly, it offers a thorough overview of why *dynamic equivalence* should be rejected. (Continued above)

The *dynamic equivalence* approach to translation attempts to preserve the basic ideas of each scriptural passage – without attempting to make a word-for-word translation. While this approach produces translations that are generally easy to understand, it necessarily denies readers access to “every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.” (Matt 4:4).

Brother Cloud observes that, in contrast to the clear warnings of scripture, the *dynamic equivalence* approach adds and subtracts from God’s words. And it substitutes man’s words for God’s words!

Watching Our Words

“And they shall turn away [their] ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables,” 2 Tim 4:4.

Speaking Truths or Fables?

“GOD HELPS THOSE WHO HELP THEMSELVES”

This saying is a fable.

Such a statement can be found nowhere in the Bible and is in fact, contrary to all the Bible teaches. We must discern whether we speak Truths or fables.

The word "fable" as found in the New Testament is a translation of the Greek word *mythos* (Strong's G3454). Though many Bible versions choose to use the word "myth", the King James Bible translators choose "fable" which, in context, is more accurate. The use of the word 'myth' lessens the nature and degree of warning intended.

Myths are made up stories that try to explain how our world works and how we should treat each other. They are stories that are part of a group's culture. Fables are made up stories or phrases that have little connection to reality and teach moral or religious lessons. They are proverbial in nature, supposedly teaching lessons by which life should be lived.

How did the extremely popular saying and misguided truth, "God helps those who help themselves originate?" Two main streams are usually sited. One derives from a story by the famous Aesop of *Aesop Fables* who lived in Greece in 6 BC. In his fable of Hercules and the Waggoner we see Hercules responding to the Waggoner who was begging for his help because his wagon wheel was stuck in the mud: "O Hercules, help me in this my hour of distress," quoth he. But Hercules appeared to him, and said: "Tut, man, don't sprawl there. Get up and put your shoulder to the wheel. The gods help them that help themselves."

This phrase encourages self sufficiency, the Bible does not. It is true that God expects us to get ourselves in motion, but then He will do the rest.

This saying is also commonly attributed to Ben Franklin for it is quoted in his *Poor Richard's Almanac*, 1757. Franklin was a Deist who believed that God did not intervene in earth's affairs. Therefore all responsibility and achievement was incumbent upon the people themselves. Another credited as originator of this saying is Algernon Sydney. It appeared in 1698 in an article titled *Discourses Concerning Government*.

Sayings similar to "God helps those who help themselves," have come down through the ages and are still used in many cultures. *Trust in God But Tie Your Camel* is an Arab proverb that teaches the same philosophy. It is attributed to the Islamic prophet Muhammad. This fable is often quoted to emphasize the importance of one depending only on oneself and reflects the lack of personal relationship with their god(s) that all religions but Christianity teach. Christianity holds that Jesus is a personal God and that he invites us to lean on Him, to wait on Him for His help, and to let Him bear our burdens. The salvation message of Christianity teaches us that without God, we are all utterly helpless and only Jesus can save us from Hell.

World Magazine August 2000 states: "*The Bible teaches that God helps those who help themselves*, was a statement in a survey by pollster George Barna on American religious beliefs.

Seventy-five percent of Americans, including more than 40% of born-again Christians agreed with the un-biblical statement which Mr. Barna said exposes American's belief that God is merely our assistant, not our foundation." It is unfortunate that so many Christians are so Biblically illiterate.

Surely the Bible does not teach self-sufficiency. Isaiah 25:4 puts it well: "For thou (God) hast been a strength to the poor, a strength to the needy in his distress, a refuge from the storm, a shadow from the heat."

To honor God we must not speak in fables that convey to others beliefs that, though in common usage, are not Biblical. []

Godliness or "A Form of Godliness" for India?

Long Hill Baptist Church was recently visited by Dr.



Enoch Kumar of India. Dr Kumar, though Indian, is a missionary to a large Hindu population in his native Bhadraviti, India. He has planted two churches, raised up a seminary and is currently working on translating the original Greek scriptures into the Indian dialect of his region, Kannada. He is committed to teaching against the false gods of the people and bringing the good news of the Gospel to the heathen population of India. He has witnessed many salvations.

In contrast we see here a photo of Pope John Paul II *participating* in the ways of the heathen. On his 1986 trip to India, Pope John Paul II allowed a Hindu Priestess to place the "aarti" mark of their god Shiva upon his forehead. Of course the Catholic press spins this event by saying the woman is a Catholic woman offering a welcome sign, but most non-Catholic writers agree that he is unmistakably receiving the mark of Shiva. Shiva represents one third of the trinity of Hindu gods.



Shiva is the destroyer and regenerator of reincarnation, of which the New Agers are so fond. This would fit with the ecumenical agenda of the popes to unify all religions under the RC umbrella. This picture of the Pope kissing the Koran represents an interfaith unity gesture towards Islam. *Jeremiah 10:2: "Thus saith the LORD, Learn not the way of the heathen."* []



The New King James Version Is Among the Most Apostate of All New Bible Versions by Jacqueline Thorpe

Because of the name of this Bible, many have been lulled into complacency regarding its content. Deceitful advertising concentrates on selling the ease of reading because of the elimination of “old, archaic English words.” This claim diverts attention from the many changes that substitute difficult and often New Age words used throughout its pages.

Thomas Nelson Publishers unobtrusively declared the New Age/One World Religion agenda of the New King James Bible (NKJV). It did this by embellishing its cover with the Triquetra, a symbol that is rooted in



pagan worship and representative of a covert ‘666’. Astonishingly, in the preface, the Triquetra is falsely explained as a Trinity symbol.

Why was this new Bible written? From our perspective, the reason appears to be twofold.

Royalties

Thomas Nelson Publishing like all businesses is interested in earnings. Publishing a Bible is very lucrative when it is rewritten and obtains a new copyright. In order to obtain a new copyright, the revision must contain a *substantial* amount of new material. (*Oh, so God’s Word must be added to and subtracted from and changed in order to be financially profitable! Woe to Pastors who encourage the use of any new Bible versions*). Note this warning from God: *Rev 22:18,19 KJV: “For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book. (Continued above)*

If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book: And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.”

This warning refers to the whole counsel of God not just the Book of Revelation! Of course, the NKJV offers the same warning. This is why, as English speaking people, we have to decide which Bible is our standard. A standard must be unchanging. Should we follow the Authorized KJV which has stood virtually unchanged for 400 years or the NKJV which has over 1200 changes including the removal of the word “God” 51 times and “Lord” 66 times? This was done to aid its need to provide *substantial material change*, thereby qualifying it for royalties. The NKJV is not a reliable, unchanging source of God’s inspired Word and should not be used for cross-referencing for its changed words change theology and doctrine.

New Age Agenda

Secondly, those involved in producing the NKJV appear to have the agenda of promoting the ecumenical New Age/ One World Religion. It is hard to believe that the men who sat on the NKJV North American Oversight Committee could have such an agenda. However, they are known to be committed to ecumenism, the uniting of all of Christianity through tolerance of diverse theologies. (Continued on page 7)

The following NKJV 'word changes' give hints of its New Age leanings:

“ In the satanic New Age Movement, Hades is an intermediate state of *purification!* The NKJV replaces “hell” 23 times with Shoal or Hades. Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary defines Hades: “the underground abode of the dead in Greek MYTHOLOGY.”

“The New Age Movement teaches a series of ages, hence the name ‘The New Age’. The NKJV changes “end of the world” to “end of the age” as well as “world to come” to “age to come.”

“The New Age Movement and the occult are longing for one called the Maitreya to appear on earth. The Bible calls him the Anti-Christ. New Agers refer to him as the *"the Coming One"* - *AND SO DOES THE NKJV!* In Luke 7:19, 20 and in Matt 11:3 NKJV, John asks his disciples to ask Jesus: *"Are you THE COMING ONE?"* The religion of Islam is waiting for their world redeemer, the Mahdi. His anticipated arrival is called “The Coming.”

The NKJV changes "Godhead" to "Divine Nature", a New Age, occult term.

In Psalms 109:6 the word "Satan" is removed.

1 Cor. 6:9 removes the word "effeminate" as does NIV, NRSV, RSV, thus theologically avoiding a condemnation of homosexuality.

The name Belial is a personification of total evil or worthlessness, i.e., Satan. In the NKJV it is changed to words such as wicked, rebel, perverted, corrupt, rebel, scoundrel, worthless, rogue, Sons of rebellion (rather than sons of Belial,) which totally undermines the power of the context and protects Satan from being maligned. The Satanic Bible names Belial as one of the Four Crown Princes of Hell and honors him. These changes are made in 15 verses. Attributing the name Belial to someone is far more condemning than calling him a rebel or scoundrel.

Space does not allow for the pages and pages that could be written exposing the satanic nature of the New Kings James Version of the Bible. The Bottom Line

When speaking of the bottom line we mean that which results from cutting through all the material that could be offered and getting to the heart of the matter for experience sake. “Seventh-day”

refers to Sabbath worship. The bottom line on all that could be said about SDA is this: they believe that “ultimately Satan will bear the guilt of human sin and cleanse heaven by carrying the guilt for sin into the lake of fire.”¹ They do not believe that the atonement is between God and people alone. They do not believe that Jesus’ resurrection was of much importance, therefore they do not give much recognition to Easter. In John 20:1, the Bible reveals that Christ rose on “first day of the week” (Sunday). Thereafter, New Testament Christians began meeting for corporate worship on Sunday (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 16:2). By worshiping on Saturday, Adventists are making an antichrist statement against the Resurrection, the heart of Christianity.

As with all cults, in Adventism, the average person is not presented with the real truth (the bottom line) of what the cult (in many cases thought to be a ‘Christian’ denomination) really has as its foundational beliefs. Most Roman Catholics, for instance, do not realize that their church believes that Jesus did not finish the work of salvation, but rather, opened the door to it making way for good works to earn salvation. Roman Catholicism is a cult because it follows the dictates of men. SDA is a cult because it follows the teaching of a prophetess, Ellen White. Jesus in numerous passages commands those he calls as disciples to “follow Me.” Should we not obey?

As with the above cults, the average Freemason does not realize that the ultimate one honored and worshiped in the depths of their organization is Satan. Dozens and dozens of books and websites verify this. (Ex. “Yes, Lucifer is God, and unfortunately Adonay is also god.” - quote by Albert Pike, 33 degree Mason.

Seventh Day Adventism (SDA)

Adventists are sorely deceived by being taught that the death and resurrection of Jesus was merely one step in a process that may lead to salvation. Most Adventist churches teach that there can be no hope of salvation for those who worship on Sunday.

Active in soliciting members, the Seventh-day Adventist denomination, which was established in 1860 in America, now has 15 million members worldwide in 61,000 churches, and they are working in 203 countries. “Adventist” refers to their belief that God raised (only) them up to announce the coming of the Lord.

Another group that honors only the Saturday Sabbath for worship is the Seventh- Day Baptist Church. Though they are not, according to their statement of faith, in agreement with SDA regarding Satan being their ultimate savior, they do regard Sabbath worship necessary for salvation.

Because these Baptists honor the doctrine of soul liberty, their practices vary according to individual church cultures but all center around Sabbath worship. They do believe in immersion and most traditional Baptist doctrines. The Seventh- Day Baptist World Federation is a member of the Baptist World Alliance. HOW CAN I BE SURE OF HEAVEN? By Pastor Bob Hammond

“Honour thy father and thy mother...”
(Ex. 20:12).

This month we were privileged to honor the moms in our church. Moms share a wonderful privilege and calling in scripture: Deuteronomy 6:4-7: "... thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: **And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children**, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.”



It’s no surprise that God calls upon moms to teach His words to their children. No one cares for a child like a faithful mom! God has given moms the

words that they need to care for the *spiritual* needs of their children

The Bible says, “all scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works,” (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

Teaching God’s words to our children is a high calling – and one that is often challenging. But, any mom who knows Christ as her Savior is equipped to begin fulfilling her responsibility. Can you recall a time when you’ve repented of your sins and placed your faith in Christ alone for salvation? *If not, why not do so today.* In coming to Christ, you take the first step toward fulfilling your calling to reach your children for Him – and to teach them His words.
